Put all your paper, plastic, cans, glass and cardboard together in the same container!

PAPER	• newspapers, magazines, & catalogs • junk mail • envelopes (plastic windows okay) • phone books • hardback & paperback books • office paper (writing, copy, computer, letterhead, NCR) • cardstock/greeting cards • paper bags • paperboard boxes (cereal, frozen food, shoe, etc.) • corrugated cardboard • milk, juice, and ice cream cartons and boxes	• facial tissues, napkins, & paper towels • used paper plates or cups • gift wrap • waxed or laminated paper or cardboard • food-contaminated boxes • pizza boxes • photo paper • shredded paper
PLASTIC	• bottles & jugs (milk, water, detergent, salad dressing, cooking oil, shampoo, spray products, etc.) • wide-mouth containers (margarine, yogurt, peanut butter, etc.) • disposable plastic cups • plastic toys • plastic lawn furniture • plastic coolers • plastic buckets • trash cans • laundry baskets • flower & nursery pots	• bags, sheeting, and bubble wrap • Styrofoam™ (plates, cups, packing material, etc.) • cutlery • straws • CD cases, VHS tapes • motor oil, pesticide, or solvent bottles • plastic electronics (alarm clock, coffee maker, etc.) • piping • vinyl siding • clam shells (bakery, salad bar, berry, etc.) • beverage can rings • candy bar and food wrappers • "K" cups
METAL & GLASS	• aluminum & steel/tin cans (drink, food, & pet food) • EMPTY aerosol cans (except pesticide and spray paint) • aluminum foil • aluminum foil bake ware • glass, food, & beverage bottles & jars (any color)	• scrap metal • propane cylinders • metal lawn chairs • pots & pans • dishes & cookware • ceramics (plates, bowls, mugs, etc.) • drinking glasses • crystal • light bulbs & tubes (incandescent, LED or fluorescent) • window glass • mirrors

Plastic bags jam machinery at the sorting facility and must NOT be used for recycling collection. Many grocery stores will accept clean, dry plastic bags for recycling or try switching to reusable bags.

Empty and rinse food containers before recycling. Caps, labels, lids and rings may stay on containers.
